

109201 - Should a new Muslim be taught all the rulings in one go?

Should the new Muslim who has recently embraced Islam be taught all the rulings and laws of Islam in one go, or in stages? Should he start with the basic beliefs or the basic rulings with the obligatory duties and prohibitions?.

Detailed answer

But should one start, straight after a person has entered Islam, with rulings on minor issues such as the beard, isbaal (letting the hem of one's clothes come below the ankle) and so on?

This should be based on what is referred to above, that the best of guidance is the guidance of



Muhammad (blessings and peace of Allah be upon him). So he should start first of all with the basics of Islam, until Islam is settled in his heart and he is at ease in his new faith. At that point we may teach him other matters, starting with the most important, then the next most important and so on. This is the way of Allah with regard to both shar'i rulings and laws of nature. Look how the foetus begins to grow bit by bit, and the four seasons change bit by bit, and the sun rises and sets similarly. If we were to teach all the rulings and so on all at once, it would take a long time and it may put him off the religion of Islam. End quote.
